dents for careers in child care and other educational settings, and provides a a seamless transition to either a Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BS) program and subsequent **certification in PreK-4th grade** and **certification in grades 7-12.** Accredited by NAEYC, the program adheres to NAEYC standards, including child development, family-teacher partnerships, observation and assessment, culturally appropriate teaching practices, academic content integration, and professionalism in early childhood education.

PROGRAM OFFERINGS

HARCUM COLLEGE operates under a rolling admissions policy, which means that the Admissions Committee reviews each application file as soon as it is complete. Applicants will be notified within 10 working days of a decision, and of any conditions necessary for entry. ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Students are required to have a minimum of 60/61 credit hours for graduation.
- Prerequisite/developmental courses may be required.
- All program specific courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher.
